LAT CH has implemented various processes and tools to identify, minimize and prevent risks related to child labor in its own operations and along its supply chain.

Compliant Procedure

In order to identify, minimize and prevent risks related to child labor as early as possible, LAT CH relies on reports submitted via its complaint channels. LAT CH employees and third parties such as customers or suppliers have several complaint channels at their disposal: for example, they can contact the Lufthansa Group Human Rights Office directly via an [electronic whistleblower system](#) or by means of an [external ombudsperson](#).
